#### First Church Contributes to Many Programs, Projects Outside Its Walls by Mike Warwick

Year after year, First Church actively supports programs and projects in the community, state, nation and world. Because an enormous amount of volunteer labor is expended on many programs supported by the people of First Church, it's hard to attach dollar amounts but the value is unquestionable.

**Examples:** The Wednesday after-school program **WOW** (**Way Out Wednesdays**), which regularly attracted more than 25 children this year; the day-long program for children offered when Kanawha County Schools are canceled because of inclement weather (**Snow Days**); and **Vacation Bible School.** Each of these programs helps introduce many children to Christ.

First Church members also prepare and serve meals to the homeless as part of the **Harvest Time** program. The more than one dozen gardeners who are active in First Church's **Community Garden** covenant to annually donate at least 10 percent of their harvest to others in need.

First Church historically pays 100 percent of its apportionments and did so in 2016. Last year's apportionments included \$18,533 for world service — a typical year. **World service** is composed of developing Christian leaders, construction and renewing of worship places, ministry with the poor, prevention of disease and elimination of poverty throughout the world.

Six special offerings last year supported programs and people outside of First Church, including a total of \$4,206 for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR); Community Development Outreach Ministries (CDOM — Heart and Hand); Scott's Run Settlement House (Monongalia County); United Methodist Student Day (for ministry scholarships); human relations; Native American awareness; and One Great Hour of Sharing (a Christian effort to empower, provide water, supply food, and give relief from disasters); and other projects.

In the wake of the **June 2016 West Virginia floods**, First Church contributed \$3,432 to the conference specifically for flood relief. The church also collected an estimated \$1,000 worth of toys and more than 50 stuffed animals and donated them to families in Clay County. The church has since continued its flood-relief efforts, sending work teams to the Clendenin area and raising \$1,540 at a pancake luncheon in March.


Members of First Church often donate cereal, canned goods and other nonperishable food items to **Heart and Hand** which are worth an average of about \$100 a month. As a result of these and other donations, no one who visits Heart and

Hand and is in need of food walks away empty handed. First Church annually participates in **Samaritan's Purse International Relief Operation Christmas Child,** which sends shoeboxes filled with gifts to children around the world. In 2016 First Church sent 25 shoeboxes with an estimated value of \$500.

Christmas food baskets for Heart and Hand is First Church's largest annual special project. We prepared 50 baskets for many years and in recent years we've upped that to 60 baskets. However, "baskets" hardly describes these gifts. In addition to a wide variety of staples, each recipient receives bags of fresh fruit and vegetables, plus a ham, milk and bread. These gifts have a total value of approximately \$9,000, which equates to \$150 per gift.




